## CF Selective Supplement I

FD067

An antimicrobial supplement recommended for the selective isolation of *Campylobacter* species.

### Composition

Per vial sufficient for 500 ml medium

#### \*Ingredients

#### Concentration

Cefoperazone

16mg

### Directions:

Rehydrate the contents of one vial aseptically with 2 ml sterile distilled water. Mix well and aseptically add the rehydrated contents to 500 ml sterile, molten, cooled (45-50°C) Blood Free *Campylobacter* Selectivity Agar Base [M887](#)/ Blood Free *Campylobacter* Selectivity HiVeg™ Agar Base [MV887](#)/ Blood Free *Campylobacter* Selectivity Agar Base, Granulated [GM887](#). Mix well and pour into sterile petri plates.

### Type of specimen

Food samples

### Specimen Collection and Handling

For Food samples follow appropriate techniques for handling specimens as per established guidelines (1). After use, contaminated materials must be sterilized by autoclaving before discarding.

Store at 2 - 8°C. Use before expiry date on the label.
