



CCV Supplement

FD247

An antibiotic supplement recommended for selective isolation of *E. coli* O157:H7.

Composition

Per vial sufficient for 1000 ml medium

*Ingredients	Concentration
Vancomycin	8mg
Cefixime	0.050mg
Cefsulodin	10mg

Directions:

Rehydrate the contents of 1 vial aseptically with 5 ml sterile distilled water. Mix gently to dissolve the contents completely. Aseptically add the rehydrated contents to 1000 ml of sterile, cooled to 45-50°C Buffered Peptone Water [M614](#)/ Buffered HiVeg™ Peptone Water [MV614](#)/ Buffered Peptone Water, Granulated [GM614](#)/ Buffered HiCynth™ Peptone Water [MCD614](#)/ Soyabean Bile Broth Base [M1286](#)/ Soyabean Bile Broth, Granulated Base [GM1286](#)/ Soyabean HiVeg™ Broth Base [MV1286](#). Mix well and dispense into sterile tubes.

Type of specimen

Clinical samples- Stool, urine, etc; Food samples

Specimen Collection and Handling

For clinical samples follow appropriate techniques for handling specimens as per established guidelines (1,2).
For Food samples follow appropriate techniques for handling specimens as per established guidelines (3).
After use, contaminated materials must be sterilized by autoclaving before discarding.

Warning & Precautions

In Vitro diagnostic use. For professional use only. Read the label before opening the container. Wear protective gloves/ protective clothing/eye protection/face protection. Follow good microbiological lab practices while handling specimens and culture. Standard precautions as per established guidelines should be followed while handling clinical specimens. Storage and Shelf Life

Store at 2 - 8°C. Use before expiry date on the label.

Disposal

User must ensure safe disposal by autoclaving and/or incineration of used or unusable preparations of this product. Follow established laboratory procedures in disposing of infectious materials and material that comes into contact with clinical sample must be decontaminated and disposed of in accordance with current laboratory techniques (1,2).
