# **Modified CFC Selective Supplement**

FD281

Recommended for the selective isolation of *Pseudomonas* species.

# **Composition**

Per vial sufficient for 500 ml medium

*Ingredients	Concentration
Cetrimide	5mg
Sodium fusidate	5mg
Cephalothin sodium salt	25mg

#### **Directions:**

Rehydrate the contents of one vial aseptically with 5 ml distilled water. Mix well and aseptically add it to 500 ml of sterile, molten, cooled (45-50°C),CFC Agar Base (Cephalothin-Sodium Fusidate-Cetrimide Agar) M1848/ CFC HiCynth<sup>TM</sup> Agar Base (Cephalothin- Sodium Fusidate- Cetrimide HiCynth<sup>TM</sup> Agar) MCD1848/ CFC Broth Base M1957. Mix well and pour into sterile Petri plates.

### Type of specimen

Food samples - meat and meat products

### **Specimen Collection and Handling**

For food samples follow appropriate techniques for handling specimens as per established guidelines (1). After use, contaminated materials must be sterilized by autoclaving before discarding.
