

# Murashige Cattleya Orchid Multiplication Medium

With Vitamins, Sucrose, Citric acid, IAA, IBA and NAA  
Without Agar

## Product Description :

Murashige *Cattleya* Orchid Multiplication Medium contains macroelements and microelements as described by Murashige and Skoog (1962) and is effective for the *in vitro* multiplication of *Cattleya* species.

It is a nutrient blend of inorganic salts, vitamins, amino acid and carbohydrate. It is supplemented with citric acid which helps in solubilization of the ferrous salts and also acts as an antioxidant. Microelements like Boron, Manganese, Molybdenum, Copper, Iron and Zinc enhance metabolism in the plants. Boron plays a key role in the carbohydrate metabolism. Inositol, Thiamine, pyridoxine, nicotinic acid act as enzymatic cofactors in universal pathways including glycolysis and TCA cycle along with the primary and secondary metabolism in the plants. The combination of auxins NAA, IAA and IBA promotes cell elongation and rooting.

The product is plant tissue culture tested but it is the sole responsibility of the user to ensure the suitability of the medium for individual species.

## Material required but not provided :

- Autoclaved distilled water
- 1N NaOH/HCl
- Gelling agents like Agar (PCT0901) or Clerigel™(PCT0903)

## Precautions :

- Ensure appropriate pH of the medium before addition of gelling agent as acidic pH will lead to decreased gelation resulting in semi solid flowing gel while alkaline pH will lead to formation of hardened gel.
- Use of Distilled water/Tissue culture grade water is recommended for media preparation as tap water or lower grade water may lead to salt precipitation and improper gelation.
- Avoid preparation of concentrated solutions, as it will lead to precipitation of salts.

## Directions :

- Reconstitute medium by adding required quantity of powder in two-third of total volume with constant, gentle stirring till the medium gets completely dissolved.
- Add heat stable supplements prior to autoclaving.
- Make up the final volume with distilled water.

- Adjust the pH of the medium to  $5.75 \pm 0.5$  using 1N NaOH/HCl.
- Add the gelling agent and heat the medium to boiling till complete dissolution of gelling agent.
- Sterilize the medium by autoclaving at 15 lbs and 121°C for 15 min.
- Cool the autoclaved medium to about 45°C before adding heat labile supplements.
- Aseptically dispense the desired amount of medium under a laminar airflow unit in sterile culture vessels.

## **Quality Control:**

### **Appearance**

White to off-white, homogenous, free flowing powder

### **Solubility**

24.6 gms/litre soluble in distilled water

### **Colour and Clarity**

Colourless to light yellow, clear solution

### **pH at 25°C**

2.70 - 3.70

### **Plant Tissue Culture Test**

The growth promoting properties of medium is assessed by providing plant cultures with relative humidity of about  $60\% \pm 2\%$ , temperature  $22^\circ\text{C} \pm 2^\circ\text{C}$  and photoperiod of about 16:8. The plant species showed actively growing callus and shoots with no structural, necrotic and toxic deformity.

## **Storage and Shelf Life:**

- The plant tissue culture medium powder is extremely hygroscopic and must be stored at 2-8°C in air tight containers.
- Preferably, entire content of each package should be used immediately after opening.
- Use before the expiry date.
